

## Activities and socialising





## People in need of residential care

Our residential services focus on each individual and their need to maintain independence through agreed interventions. Our residential service is a community within a community whilst facilitating the freedom to access the wider local facilities at will.

## People in need of nursing care

Our nursing services support people with more complex medical needs. Our philosophy is promoting independence and enabling the living of positive lives that challenge individuals and supports a 'can-do' attitude.

### People in need of rehabilitation or therapy

We aim to promote independent living. Our achievement is measured by people returning successfully to their own home. As part of this we access veterans services as well as health and social care.

## Flexible respite options

For individuals or couples who wish to remain at home but visit us for short periods of care. Our nursing and care staff are trained to a high standard, supported by skilled and experienced ancillary staff who have specialist training to ensure outstanding standards are part of our culture.

## **HEALTH AND WELLBEING**



## OUR OTHER CARE ACCOMMODATION

### Admiral Jellicoe House, Portsmouth

Setting a new standard in care, Admiral Jellicoe House is the latest addition to the Royal Naval Benevolent Trust care facilities offering resident-centred care and dedicated dementia support to veterans and their dependants in Portsmouth, home of the Royal Navy. Facilities include 66 luxury en suite rooms, an in-house library, cinema room, bar, formal and informal dining room and a communal balcony overlooking the neighbouring park and cricket ground.

Completed in 2022, this impressive home marks the centenary of the RNBT and is named after the founder of the RNBT, Admiral Jellicoe.

Pembroke House provides high quality care in an exceptional environment that has a healthy respect for the customs and traditions of the Royal Navy. We provide a welcoming and caring extended family atmosphere to create a home from home for all of our residents. Built as an orphanage in the 1920s, Pembroke House was converted into a residential home in 1952. It has been substantially extended and modernised to become the fine care home that it is today.

Pembroke House was named after HMS Pembroke shore barracks at Chatham.

Designed by Sir Henry Pilkington, the barracks were completed in 1903 and decommissioned in 1984 following the closure of the Chatham Dockyard and Naval Base. The site is now the main campus of the Universities at Medway, just a short walk from Pembroke House.
